North American Bridge Championship:

An Exciting and Fun Event

Whether you're a beginner or an aspiring world champion, there is something fun, exciting, and challenging coming to The San Francisco Marriott Convention Center, November 27 to December 7. The North American Bridge Championships (NABC) will be here.

NABC's are the premier bridge events in North America and are attended by players from all over the world. But you needn't be intimated if you're just starting out. There is an exciting schedule of Gold Rush, Intermediate, and Novice (GRIN) games, lessons, and special events for you.

GRIN Events

Daily games will include morning and afternoon sessions for players with **0–299** masterpoints, along with **Gold Rush two-session events** open to players with up to **750 masterpoints**, offering the chance to earn coveted gold points.

Education will be front and center, with **celebrity speakers** featured most days at **9:15 a.m.** and **2:15 p.m.**, giving participants expert strategies to sharpen their play. (Continued on page 2)

On Saturday, it's pairs day. At 10:00, we'll have a single session 99er pairs, a 499er pairs, a single session stratified open pairs, and the first session of the dual session stratified open pairs. The second session of the open pairs is at 3:00 with another single session open pairs. All table fees \$18.

Sunday is two session bracketed swiss teams. Start time is also 10:00. The second session is 2:30 or as is announced by the director.

Playing in a social game on my cruise we arrived at 4♥'s. North was a little excited when South bid 2♦. We may be high, but we deal with what we have

The J♣ is led. We have 1♣, 5♥'s and 1♠. That's 7. we can get 1 or 2 more from ♣'s (lead to the Q for 1, 3-3 split for the other), and 1 from a ♦ ruff. That's 10. If the ♣'s don't split, maybe we can find a squeeze in the pointed suits (♦'s & ♠'s). We play the A♣ at trick 1, and lead toward the Q♠. East plays the K (Major part of the solution worked). East attempted to cash the K♠. I ruffed low, and led the 3♦. West wins with the 6 and leads a trump. K♥ wins in dummy, East contributing the 9, South the 5. I lead the 5♦ and East rises with the A, winning the trick. East leads the T♣, South ruffing with the J♥, and West is caught. (The end position and the rest are on page 3.)

West must now play. If West pitches a \blacklozenge , I can ruff a \blacklozenge to make the J good, if West pitches a \clubsuit the \clubsuit 's are all good, so West must underruff. But this just delays the inevitable. I can still ruff the \spadesuit with the $\$\Psi$'s, cash the $\$\Psi$'s cross back to my hand with the $\$\Psi$'s and led the $\$\Psi$ and West is squeezed in the pointed suits.

Turnout has been disappointing at both sectionals and unit games ever since the pandemic. While turnout is down at both sectionals, it's particularly bad for the summer/fall.

Our second sectional has historically been in June, but turnout was so poor last year that we thought maybe having it in September would be better. It was worse. What was particularly surprising was that a lot of local players who come to unit games didn't come to the sectional. We could have almost had the sectional in the room we use for unit games.

So, we are asking you, the unit members, for suggestions? What can we do to improve attendance? Is there something we can change to entice more of you to come?

Costs continue go rise. Rent for unit games is \$577. For the sectional, it's nearing \$5,000. Director fees are up. Food costs more. Yet, attendance is down. We've reluctantly raised sectional table fees starting next year, as have other units. We trying to hold the line on unit game fees. But something has to change.
